This was the first reading of School Board Policy 414 dealing with the Mandating Reporting of Child Neglect or Physical or Sexual Abuse. There was one change to the policy under reporting procedures. A second reading of Policy 414 and recommendation for approval will be presented at the October 21st School Board Meeting.

# 4. Policy 616 - School District System Accountability This was the first reading of Policy 616 dealing with School District System Accountability. Changes to two sections were noted. A second reading of Policy 616 and recommendation for approval will be presented at the October 21st School Board Meeting. REPORTS Superintendent Report: Superintendent Laney updated the Board on the District Enrollment numbers as of October 7. District wide 63% of the students are residents – 37% are non residents. Wilshire Park is at 85% resident students. All 112 kindergarten students are residents. He also mentioned a tentative contract agreement has been made with the School Nutrition group and the 9th Grade Respect Retreat facilitated by Youth Frontiers, lead by the Connection Crew and Bonnie Brever was a great success. The goal of the retreat is to build community within the 9th grade class and establish our District Values with them, Academics, Character and Community. **Board Member Reports:** Andrea Scamehorn: Andrea Scamehorn attended AMSD, MSBA, and MSHSL meetings and a Middle School Parent meeting.
